Moving to San Diego

Pre-Arrival

Flying To San Diego

- 1. Before traveling: call OPCON (619-553-8666) to schedule a duty driver for pick-up prior to arrival date. Clarify if needing a barracks room, living out in town or staying at an NGIS (pg. 14).
- 2. Stop by Pass and ID (174 Rosecrans St., San Diego, CA 92106) to get CAC coded for enclave access.
- 3. Meet with CDO at CSS-11 QD. Give orders to OPCON to be stamped and given guidance on next steps.

Driving To San Diego

- 1. Before traveling: call OPCON (619-553-8666) to notify of arrival date. Clarify if needing a barracks room, living out in town or staying at an NGIS (pg. 14).
- 2. Stop by Pass and ID (174 Rosecrans St., San Diego, CA 92106) to get CAC coded for enclave access.
- 3. Meet with CDO at CSS-11 QD. Give orders to OPCON to be stamped and given guidance on next steps.

Budgeting

Moving to a high cost-of-living area like San Diego can be exciting, but it requires careful financial planning to maintain stability. A good rule-of-thumb is to start with researching housing options and consider areas you would like to reside in and take a look at the BAH rates for appropriate paygrade (with or without dependents). This amount is averaged based on the total combined cost of rent, electricity and utilities. Next, look at creating a detailed budget accounting for higher expenses such as utilities, groceries, transportation and entertainment. Additionally, build an emergency fund before relocating to provide a buffer while you adjust to the new cost environment. Finally, check in with your Command Financial Specialist-they can help you learn about resources, discounts and ways to connect with others who have navigated similar moves.

What is CSS-11?

Commander, Submarine Squadron 11 provides training, material and personnel readiness support for the medium auxiliary floating dry dock ARCO (ARDM 5), Undersea Rescue Command and Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarines, capable of supporting various missions, including: anti-submarine warfare; anti-ship warfare; strike warfare; and intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance. CSS-11 was commisioned on July 1, 1986 aboard her flagship USS McKee (AS 41), at Naval Base Point Loma, as a result of a reorganization of Commander, Submarine Group 5.

Alexandria is the third vessel in the history of the United States Navy to be ar the name Alexandria and is named for both Alexandria, Virginia and Alexandria, Louisiana. Her keel was laid down on June 19, 1987. She was launched on June 23, 1990 and commissioned June 29, 1991.

What is SSN 763?

The Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine USS Santa Fe (SSN 763) is capable of supporting various missions, including: anti-submarine warfare; anti-ship warfare; strike warfare; and intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance. Santa Fe is the second vessel to be named for Santa Fe, New Mexico. Her keel was laid down on July 9, 1991, launched on December 12, 1992 and commissioned January 8, 1994.

What is SSN 772?

The Los Angeles-class fast-attack submarine USS Greeneville (SSN 772) is capable of supporting various missions, including: anti-submarine warfare; anti-ship warfare; strike warfare; and intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance. Greeneville is the only vessel in United States Navy history to be named after Greeneville, Tennesee. Her keel was laid down on February 28, 1992, launched on September 17, 1994 and commisioned February 16, 1996.

What is URC?

Undersea Rescue Command (URC) is home to the United States Navy's submarine rescue specialists. URC provides operational, administrative, maintenance and logistical oversight of the Navy's shallow and deep water rescue systems as well as the Remotely Operated Vehicle (ROV) intervention system. URC uses a combination of active duty Sailors, Reserve component personnel, and government contractors to provide 24/7 worldwide submarine rescue coverage for the United States and allied submarines. URC is the sole U.S. provider of submarine rescue capability for the United States Navy and is located onboard Naval Air Station North Island.

What is ARDM 5?

ARCO (ARDM 5), the second drydock to bear the name ARCO, was built by the Todd Pacific Shipyard Corporation, Seattle, Washington. ARCO was placed in service on June 23, 1988. ARCO has a lifting capacity of 1800 long tons, is 492 feet long, 96 feet wide and has a wing wall height of 61 feet. The drydock is equipped with two wing wall cranes capable of lifting up to 25 tons each. ARCO is used primarily for dry-docking and servicing Los Angeles-class submarines.

Fleet and Family Support Center (FFSC)

FFSC supports individual and family readiness through a full array of programs and resources which help Navy families to be resilient, well-informed and adaptable to the Navy environment. The Naval Complex San Diego FFSC serves active duty members, retired personnel and family members with programs and services to enhance their quality of life.

Public/Private Venture (PPV) Housing

PPV housing is also referred to as privatized military housing. Naval Complex San Diego has partnered with Lincoln Military Housing to offer you and your family outstanding PPV housing choices. PPV housing is owned by Lincoln Military Housing and governed by business agreements in which Lincoln Military Housing is responsible for the maintenance and day-to-day management of the housing. PPV housing may be located on or off government property.

Community Housing

Community Housing is any housing that a service member may choose that is not PPV or government operated. This is housing outside of the base that is privately owned and operated. This can include apartment complexes and single family homes for rent.

Housing Early Application Tool (HEAT)

HEAT allows Sailors and their spouses to apply for housing at one or more locations before or after they receive their PCS orders. Spouses can use the application as well, needing only minimal information about their Sailor. Naval Complex San Diego currently accepts HEAT applications.

Schools and Education

Public School

The San Diego Unified School District is the largest in the county, and the eighth largest urban school district in the nation. The district serves most of the metropolitan area within the San Diego city limits and provides a variety of educational programs and options for students in kindergarten through high school. It operates as a system of neighborhood schools with all children elgible to attend the school serving their residential address. School districts in San Diego allow families to transfer from one school to another within the same school district or transfer to another school district. Timelines of enrollment period should be noted if parents are considering transferring their children.

Private School

San Diego County is home to more than 200 private primary and secondary schools. These alternatives to public schools offer families a learning atmosphere tailored to their own philosophies and their children's specific needs.

Accreditation by independent agencies is available to private schools. Schools volunteer to have their programs inspected and evaluated. Tuition varies by each school.

Private schools widely vary, from highly structured to self-directed learning environments, to college prep and curriculum strong in artistic expression.

Home School

Each state has different laws governing home schooling. Many communities have organizations that assist home schooling families with curriculum and opportunities to meet other home school students. Options for homeschooling your child include:

- The local school district
- Online programs
- Private companies
- Independently (by filing an affidavit with the State of California)

If homeschooling your child is provided through the local school district, online program or private company, your child will be provided a standard curriculum to follow and assigned a teacher who will monitor your child's progress.

If you wish to home school independently, you must file a private school affidavit with the state of California. You, as the parent, will then be responsible for creating your own curriculum and submitting all documentation and testing to the state.

You will be provided 3 minutes to complete a 4-question quiz to verify your identity. Responses may include providing your DoD ID number and some personel information, including: financial questions, past addresses, etc.
- You will create your MHS Genesis Patient Portal password in the online registration process. A new passwork will need to be created 180 days.
- Once you have successfully created your DS Logon, click on "Upgrade To Premium Account" to upgrade your account to Premium Access to view your health information.
- Active duty military and families will need to keep your TRICARE Online accounts. i.e. When you PCS from another base/location, your new duty station's military hospital or clinic may not be using MHS Genesis yet.

The Department of Environmental Health and Quality's Beach and Bay Water Quality Monitoring Program protects the public health of millions of residents and visitors each year through beach water testing, public eduction, outreach and beach postings. Beach postings can include water **advisories**, **warnings** and **closures** when there is contamination, such as sewage.

Refer to **sdbeachinfo.com** to check the beach water quality status to make informed decisions about water quality health risks. Health risks are higher when water samples fail state health standards and this website is updated immediately when beach status changes (advisories or closures) are made. The website also provides external links to the State's sample results and advisories database.




