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Pre-Arrival Checklist

Here are some items to keep in mind as you prepare to PCS to Guam:

No-Fee Passport

U.S. Active Duty do not require no-fee passports but do require military ID cards and travel orders. U.S. government civilians and eligible family members should have a valid no-fee passport prior to arrival on Guam. Although PCS to most U.S. possessions does not normally require a passport, PCS to Guam requires one in case of medical or other emergency evacuation (typhoon, etc.) to a country that requires it. PCS travelers who have submitted an application for a no-fee passport may proceed to Guam on a regular tourist passport obtained at personal expense (not reimbursable) or may proceed on ID card and orders provided they do not transit Japan en route to Guam.

Overseas Screening

Due to Guam's location, some medical specialties are not available. Overseas Screening (OSS) ensures the medical needs of service members and families can be appropriately met while in Guam. According to BUMEDINST 1300.2A, OSS when transitioning to Guam is mandatory and must be completed within 30 days of receipt of PCS orders. It is important that an OSS be completed on each service and family member. This is a requirement for anyone PCSing to an OCONUS location (includes Guam to Guam duty stations).

To expedite the screening process:

- Start the OSS process immediately upon receipt of verbal orders.
- Only appointed screeners are able to request OSS for service and family members.
- Provide the DD2807-1 and the 1300-1 and any additional information along with the request for OSS.
- Ensure eligible family members with special needs, whether they be medical, educational, or both, are enrolled in the Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP).
- To check-in with Tricare, please have a copy of your endorsed NAVPERS 1300/16, NAVMED 1300/1 and DD Form 2807-1 for each dependent. Failure to provide these documents will result in the service member and family to be re-screened at USNH Guam. **Keep ALL original copies with you and make copies.**

Shipping Your Car

As part of your PCS to Guam, the government will cover expenses to ship one vehicle per household. If you would like to ship an additional vehicle, you will have to pay out of pocket. Keep in mind it takes approximately two months for your vehicle to ship to Guam, depending on your place of origin. Another option is to look into purchasing a vehicle upon arrival to Guam. Because Guam is your final destination, no rental car included in your orders; any rental car you procure upon arrival will be at your own expense. Currently, there is no base transit system in place on Guam. For more information, visit the Vehicle Processing Center (VPC) website at www.pcsmypov.com or reach out to your sponsor. Pre-Arrival Checklist

Bringing Your Pets

Guam is a rabies-free island. If you are planning on bringing your dog(s) or cat(s) with you to Guam, you must complete a 120-day, 30-day, or 5-day quarantine depending on your previous duty station (e.g., Hawaii is also rabies-free). Check with your veterinarian for your specific requirements.

You must complete an entry permit application and provide payment (\$60 per pet, non-refundable). Payment for the entry permit from the Guam Department of Agriculture can be made via money order, certified/cashier's check (any bank) or personal check (bank MUST have a Guam location). Make checks payable to "Treasurer of Guam." Licensing on Guam is \$5 per pet per year and should be included with the entry permit payment or upon arrival.

Fax all required paperwork (next two pages) to Guam's Department of Agriculture at (671) 734-6569 or gu.agri@yahoo.com no later than four weeks prior to pet entry. Ten days prior to arrival, submit a health certificate, flight itinerary* and quarantine facility confirmation** for each pet to the same fax number or e-mail.

*You will not be reimbursed for the cost of your pet's flight. Check the United Airlines pet policy for additional information and requirements.

**There are three boarding/quarantine facilities on Guam for inbound dogs/cats (p.26). Boarding cost will vary but may be partially reimbursable, so keep your receipt.

For additional information on pets, see p.26 of this booklet. Contact the Guam Department of Agriculture for specific requirements for pets other than dogs/cats.

Pets may be transported on flights operated by United Airlines, the Patriot Express or petonly charters.

Bringing Your Pets (cont.)

Required paperwork for quarantine:

120-day. The following must be submitted prior to approval of entry permit:

- A copy of a valid rabies vaccination certificate administered no less than 30 days and no more than one year prior to approval of entry permit.
- A copy of the record of required annual immunizations administered no less than 10 days and no more than 6 months prior to approval of entry permit.
- Confirmation of kennel reservation made with quarantine facility.
- A copy of a valid health certificate issued no more than 10 days prior to flight.
- Copy of completed permit application.
- \$60 non-refundable entry fee. Make checks payable to "Treasurer of Guam" and mail to: Department of Agriculture/Animal Quarantine, 163 Dairy Road, Mangilao, Guam 96913.

30-day. The following must be submitted prior to approval of entry permit:

- Copy of the results of a Rabies antibody test (OIE-FAVN) processed 90 days before entry to Guam. Microchip number is required for this test.
- Copy of 2 valid rabies vaccination certificates administered no less than 3 months apart prior to approval of entry permit.
- Copy of the record of required annual immunizations administered no less than 10 days and no more than 6 months prior to approval of entry permit.
- Confirmation of kennel reservation made with quarantine facility (provide kennel name and staff will contact kennel to confirm reservation).
- Copy of a valid health certificate issued no more than 10 days prior to flight.
- Copy of completed permit application.
- \$60 non-refundable entry fee. Make checks payable to "Treasurer of Guam" and mail to: Department of Agriculture/Animal Quarantine, 163 Dairy Road, Mangilao, Guam 96913.

Pre-Arrival Checklist

5-day. The following must be submitted prior to approval of entry permit:

- Copy of the results of a Rabies antibody test (OIE-FAVN) processed 120 days before entry to Guam. Microchip number is required for this test.
- Copy of 2 valid rabies vaccination certificates administered no less than 3 months apart prior to approval of entry permit.
- Copy of the record of required annual immunizations administered no less than 10 days and no more than 6 months prior to approval of entry permit.
- Confirmation of kennel reservation made with quarantine facility (provide kennel name and staff will contact kennel to confirm reservation).
- A copy of a valid health certificate issued no more than 10 days prior to flight.
- Copy of completed permit application.
- \$60 (non-refundable) entry fee. Make checks payable to "Treasurer of Guam" and mail to: Department of Agriculture/Animal Quarantine, 163 Dairy Road, Mangilao, Guam 96913.

Budgeting

Moving to Guam can be expensive; it may cost between \$5,000-\$10,000 up-front. Make sure you have money saved to ensure your PCS is less stressful. Set aside money for hotel payment and other start-up items when you arrive, (such as phone, initial rent, starting gas, electric, power, groceries, etc.), as well as extra money if you are shipping pets or need to purchase uniforms for your child(ren). Start planning for expenses **now** so you are not in a tough spot upon arrival and until your reimbursements (TLA, OHA, etc.) are processed.

Save all of your receipts until your PCS is complete and you have been reimbursed for applicable items.

Congratulations! You have arrived on Guam! This checklist will help you navigate the transition process. There are many resources that are intended to ease your transition to life on Guam. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to reach out and ask for help!

Obtain endorsed orders. - Upon arrival on Guam, the service member must check in with their command to have their orders endorsed. Without stamped orders, you cannot begin any other process.

Gather your important documents (You will want to have these with you throughout the entire check-in process):

10 copies of your stamped orders

10 copies of your Page 2

5 copies of your Overseas Screening (OSS): Do not give the original copy to ANYONE! Ensure each copy contains all 4 pages.

Powers of Attorney (if you don't already have them, now would be a good time to obtain them (pg. 31)

Housing and Temporary Lodging

Check in with the Housing Office - Regardless of whether you are going to live on-base or off-base, you must check in with the Housing Office within 48 hours of arrival. This will ensure eligibility for Temporary Lodging Assistance (TLA). Please take the following items with you:

1 copy of your stamped orders

1 copy of your Page 2

1 copy of your Overseas Screening (OSS)

Navy Gateway Inns & Suites is the primary temporary housing (pg. 5). If NGIS doesn't have availability, you MUST obtain a Certificate of Non-Availability (CNA) before making reservations with a TLA-approved hotel.

Attend TLA brief/complete worksheet at PSD (service member only).

Paperwork (hotel receipts) must be submitted to service members command administration department every 10 days.

ON-BASE

Complete the housing application (DD Form 1746).

Select desired residence and complete necessary paperwork.

Schedule delivery of loaner furniture, if necessary (Self Help: 671-339-5246 & Loaner furniture: 671-333-2081/2).

Walk through the unit with a housing representative and receive keys.

Contact FFSC for household items (such as pots, pans, and dished) needed from the Loan Locker (671-333-2056).

OFF-BASE

Complete DD Form 2367.

Select desired residence.

Ensure the unit has been inspected and validated by the Housing Office (if unit requires an inspection, the Housing Office requires 3 days minimum to complete.

Present a valid lease agreement, OHA declaration and Military Clause to the Housing Office (DO NOT SIGN LEASE WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL FROM THE HOUSING OFFICE).

If requesting advanced allowances, follow up to ensure that PSD has received all necessary paperwork from the Housing Office.


Schedule delivery of loan furniture if necessary; contact FFSC for items needed from the Loan Locker.

Complete annual certifications to ensure the entitlements continue (if this applies to homeowners and members who have initated a long term lease agreement).



Determine whether or not you have mail delivery services at your residence. If living off base, many houses are not registered for mail delivery. Because of this, you may need to obtain a post office box or contact your local post office for instructions on how to apply for mail delivery.

Update or obtain renter's insurance.

Common Pay and Allowances

Overseas Housing Allowance (OHA)

Active Duty members who are stationed overseas (except for Alaska and Hawaii), and are authorized to live off-base at government expense, do not receive a Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH). Instead, in Guam, you will receive Overseas Housing Allowance, or OHA.

What's the difference? BAH pays a set monthly rate, based on the member's paygrade, location, and whether or not the service member has any dependents. In other words, if the set rate for a member is \$750 per month, that's what he/she receives, no matter how much the member actually pays for rent and utility costs.

OHA is based on the actual amount of rent. For each location, service members are assigned a maximum rental cap, which is based on average rental costs for the area, depending on the service member's paygrade and whether or not he/she is residing with dependents. If the service member resides off-base, at a monthly rate lower than the allotted amount, the amount paid to the service member will not exceed the monthly cost. For example, your maximum OHA is \$2,450. You find a rental property for \$1,800. You would only receive \$1,800/month for OHA.

Utility/Recurring Maintenance Allowance

The Utility/Recurring Maintenance Allowance is paid monthly to defray expenses paid directly to utility companies and expenses incurred from recurring maintenance and minor repairs for the leased residence. Expense data gathered from members receiving OHA and paying their own utility bills determines this allowance, set to cover the 80th percentile of reported costs. Members with utilities paid by the landlord do not receive this allowance; it is added to the rental allowance. Members without dependents, and paying their own utilities, are entitled to 75 percent of the rate set for members with dependents. Please note that although there is a separate allowance for rent and utilities, housing allowances appear as a single amount in a pay statement.

Cost of Living Allowance (COLA)

The Overseas Cost of Living Allowance (COLA) is a non-taxable allowance designed to offset the higher overseas prices of non-housing goods and services. Overseas COLA is not a fixed amount.

Move-In Housing Allowance (MIHA)

MIHA partially defrays move-in costs associated with occupying privately leased quarters. MIHA (Miscellaneous) is an up-front, lump sum payment that reflects average expenditures to make dwellings habitable (e.g. transformers, supplemental heating equipment, wardrobes, electricity connection). Members with and without dependents receive the full allowance with their first OHA rental payment. This allowance does not cover any moving-out costs.

Dislocation Allowance (DLA)

The purpose of DLA is to partially reimburse a member for the expenses incurred in relocating the household on a PCS, ordered for the Government's convenience, or incident to an evacuation. This allowance is in addition to all other allowances authorized in the Joint Travel Regulation (JTR) and may be paid in advance.

Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA)

TLA is a permanent change of station (PCS) allowance payable incident to a member's initial reporting to an overseas Permanent Duty Station (PDS), detaching from an overseas PDS, or requiring temporary lodging under other circumstances. TLA is authorized to partially reimburse a servicemember for more than normal expenses incident to the use of temporary lodging outside CONUS. Single Sailors arriving to a submarine are not authorized TLA; however, married Sailors arriving to a submarine must have their dependents with them to be authorized TLA.

Vehicle Registration

You will be notified via email when your POV (Privately Owned Vehicle) is on island and ready to be pickup up from the VPC (Vehicle Processing Center). A Temporary Vehicle Permit from the Department of Motor Vehicles is required for you to pick up your POV. The permit is good for 5 days, and the fee is \$5.00*. The POV Office on Naval Base Guam will not release your POV without the temporary permit. Below is a step-by-step checklist to help you register your vehicle on Guam:

Go to the VPC to pick up your information packet. Be sure to bring with you:

Current registration

Proof of insurance (verify your coverage is effective on Guam)

Current driver's license

All documentation provided to you when you initially shipped your vehicle.

The VPC is located on Naval Base Guam in Building 3179 (see map on p. 30), 671-339-2205. For more information, visit the VPC website www.pcsmypov.com (look up Guam VPC under locations)

Go to the Guam Department of Motor Vehicles in Tamuning to obtain the temporary permit required to pick up your vehicle from the VPC. Bring the above items with you in addition to a \$5 fee (*you will be charged an extra fee to use a credit card).

Take your VPC information packet and all other documentation to Customs. At Customs, the packet will be reviewed and approved. Once complete, take the approved paperwork back to VPC to obtain your POV. Customs is located on the 1st floor of the Port Authority Building (Closed daily for lunch from 1200-1300). 
Driving Directions to the Vehicle Processing Center

Take your temporary permit, all documents referenced above, and all paperwork given to you at the time of shipment to the VPC on Naval Base Guam. Conduct inspection and sign for your car.

Obtain a vehicle safety inspection on your vehicle. The fee for safety inspections is \$15. Please be sure to have your current vehicle registration on hand and go to one of the following locations:

Go back to the Department of Motor Vehicles to register your vehicle. Registration fees will vary according to type of vehicle. Fees are based on weight and capacity. The registration fee for a sedan can range from \$58-\$65. Fees for pick-up trucks will be slightly higher due to the capacity and weight of the vehicle. Obtaining A Driver's License

Active Duty members possessing a valid driver's licensed are NOT required to get a Guam Driver's License. Sailors with a driver's license that will expire during their tour on Guam will only be required to obtain a Guam driver's license IF the state that issued the Driver's License does not automatically extend the validity of the license because of the service member's Active Duty status.

A person having in his/her immediate possession a valid operator's or chauffer's license issued by any other territory, Commonwealth, or state of the United States, may drive a motor vehicle upon the roads and highways for a period not exceeding 30 days from the date such person arrived on Guam. However, upon the expiration of the 30-day period, such person must have been issued a Guam Driver's License in order to continue driving on Guam. If you are a military dependent and wish to drive on Guam, you MUST obtain a Guam driver's license within 30 days after arrival.





CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTERS

The Child Development Center (CDC) provides center-based care for children 6 weeks to 5 years of age. The CDC is open to active duty military and DoD/NAF civilian personnel families and is committed to providing the best developmental experiences for all children. The curriculum is designed to meet the cognitive, social, emotional, and physical needs of children by using developmentally age-appropriate activities. When accepting placement for full-time care, the CDC will need the following to process enrollment:

	Permission Statements: You must provide updated parent permissions for field trips and transportation, media release, topical non-prescription medication application, and any other applicable authorizations/releases.
	Parent Fee Agreement: After your family's income has been verified, you must sign a Parent Fee Agreement.

SCHOOL AGE CARE (SAC)

Our Navy School-Age Care program is accredited by the National Afterschool Association and is also affiliated with the Boys and Girls Club of America. Our School Age Care children engage in activities which focus on the Boys & Girls Club Core Programs: Character & Leadership, Education and Career, Health & Life Skills, and The Arts, Sports, Fitness, & Recreation. Different clubs are offered daily such as Power Hour, Image Makers (Photography), Ultimate Journey, Fitness Authority, Smart Moves, and Fine Arts. Special activities are offered for different occasions, and we highly encourage parent participation for the special programming. During Summer Day Camp, a variety of field trips are offered such as swimming, bowling, hiking, going to the theatre, water parks, and much more.

We offer full-time care and drop-in care. Please note that drop-in services are on based on space availability and are offered for two days out of the week.

Children enrolled in kindergarten to 6th grade (ages 5-12 years) may attend the School Age Program.

YOUTH & TEEN CENTER

The Teen Center is for teens/preteens age 10-18. There is no registration fee; however, parents must fill out a registration packet. The program has a "Self Release Policy" (in accordance with the unattended base instruction), so teens may sign themselves in and out of the center. Program activities are focused on the Boys & Girls Club of America Core Programs Character and Leadership, Education and Career, Health and Life Skills, The Arts, Sports, Fitness, & Recreation. Teens are also encouraged to participate in club activities such as Power Hour, Image Makers (Photography), Torch Club, Fitness Authority, Smart Girls, Fine Arts, Career Launch, Passport to Manhood, and Special Events.

The Guam Youth Sports Association promotes an active lifestyle that allows young athletes to test their physical abilities as well as learn important values such as teamwork, leadership, and discipline. GYSA offers a variety of sports activities that are both fun and challenging.

Eligibility: Developmental child care and youth recreational programs are available to all active duty military, activated reservists and guardsmen, DoD civilian personnel and DoD contractors. Youth recreational programs are also available to military retirees and DoD civilian retirees.



POST ARRIVAL INFORMATION

Any dog or cat eligible for the 5-day quarantine program shall be transported to the designated quarantine facility, where a post-arrival examination by the Territorial Veterinarian or a licensed veterinarian approved by the Director must be completed within 24 hours of arrival. ALL animals go to the quarantine facility upon arrival and until clearance by the veterinarian.

If the documentation is incorrect or incomplete, arriving animals will be sent to a Quarantine Facility for quarantine awaiting proper documentation. If documentation is incomplete to meet the requirements of the 5 or less day quarantine program, the 30-day program or 120-day program will go into effect.

The veterinarian responsible for post-arrival examination must submit a health examination certificate to the department verifying the health of the dog or cat and provide his/her recommendation for the animal's early release or continued quarantine status as deemed necessary. The examination certificate along with the attending veterinarian's recommendation must be submitted to the department prior to approval and release of any dogs or cats. A Certificate of Completion must be obtained from the department prior to release.

The post-arrival examining veterinarian may require quarantine for observation for animals that show any signs of illness or disease during the examination.

Animals eligible for the 5-day quarantine program but are quarantined by the examining veterinarian during post-arrival examinaation due to unusual health anomalies must be cleared for release by the Territorial Veterinarian or a licensed veterinarian approved by the Director.

Upon release from Quarantine, Register your Pet

Animals must be registered within 30 days after moving into base housing with the U.S. Army Veterinary Detachment, Guam. Registration must be updated annually and be accompanied by a current rabies vaccination certificate. Families living in off-base housing should register their pets with the Government of Guam. If not completed prior to your PCS, ensure you pay the Department of Agriculture the non-refundable \$60 per pet for the entry permit, as well as \$5 per pet per year for the licensing fee.

Pet Quarantine Reimbursement

Reimbursement for actual mandatory quarantine fees for household pets is authorized not to exceed \$550 per PCS move. Keep receipts for quarantine expenses and file your claim with NBG, Personnel Support Detachment (PSD) upon your arrival to Guam.

Vaccinations, Licensing and Registration

Guam does not have strict leash or pet licensing and registration laws, but if you live on base your pet must always be on a leash, micro-chipped, and registered at the Boller Veterinary Clinic on Naval Base Guam or the Andersen Veterinary Treatment Facility on Andersen Air Force Base.

VETERINARY SERVICES & CLINICS

The Boller Veterinary Clinic and the Andersen Veterinary Treatment Facility are fully operated vet clinics (i.e. grooming services, vaccinations, spay/neutering services, micro-chipping, de-worming, etc), but do not have emergency care. Emergency Preparedness

Disaster preparedness is a necessary part of life on Guam. It is important to make sure that the entire family is prepared and informed in the event of a disaster or emergency. Familiarize yourself with local emergency procedures. Make a plan for natural/man made disasters and remain ready at any time. One of the primary emergency situations that you should prepare for is typhoons. Because of Guam's location the island is prone to typhoons at any time of year; however, typhoon season is considered to be June-November.

Joint Region Marianas Typhoon Preparedness

JRM offers awareness information and preparedness tips for the eventuality of a typhoon approaching or hitting Guam. Based on information received from the Joint Typhoon Warning Center (JTWC), JRM will set conditions according to the time destructive winds (50 knots) or greater are expected to reach Guam:

COR 4 - CONDITION OF READINESS 4

Guam is in COR 4 year round due to our location in typhoon alley, until a higher condition is set. This means that at any time, destructive winds could be upon us within 72 hours.

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Maintain areas around the house clear of debris and loose material.

Dead branches should be pruned/removed from trees.

Most NBG homes are built for major typhoon winds with typhoon shutters.

Maintain and test shutters routinely.

Determine location of official shelters (will be announced).

Create and maintain your typhoon supply locker.

Have a personal list of ER and family telephone numbers to call.

Copy important documents with originals in a safe place.

Have a personal list of hotels and costs, and whether or not they accept pets if needed.

COR 3 - CONDITION OF READINESS 3

Destructive winds are possible within in 48 hours.

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Clean/bleach and fill bathtubs, plastic trash cans (with wheels) with water

Set refrigerator to coldest settings.

Freeze water in jugs.

Fill vehicle fuel tanks.

Check your generator, test run it, have adequate fuel safely stored(see below)

Get cash, ATMs may not work after the storm.

Secure yard equipment, move plants inside.

Protect electronics (bag, prepare to move to an interior room /off floor).

Have a supply of rags and old towels.

Double check your Typhoon Supply Locker.

COR 2 - CONDITION OF READINESS 2

Destructive winds are anticipated within 24 hours.

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

Naval Base Guam homes are built for major typhoon winds with typhoon shutters. Prepare to shelter in place.

Close typhoon shutters.

Fill containers and your bathtub with clean water and keep them covered.

Turn up refrigerator and freezer to their coldest setting and pack your freezer tightly with newspaper (This will keep your food colder longer).

Secure cars: 1) Set your emergency brake 2) Close all windows and doors tightly.

Move carpet and furniture away from windows.

Consider evacuation to an official shelter if your home is not storm proof.

Complete your last errands then stay off the road.

Stay tuned to local broadcasts and in touch with your command.

Expect a call from USNH if more than 37 weeks pregnant or high risk.

COR 1 - CONDITION OF READINESS 1

Destructive winds are anticipated within 12 hours (or already occuring). Only emergency vehicles are allowed on the road.

WHAT SHOULD I DO?

NBG main gate and Polaris Point gates are closed to all traffic.

Stay indoors – ABSOLUTELY STAY INDOORS.

At the eye of the storm you will be curious to go outside and view the situation. Do not go outside. The eye lasts only a short time and the winds start up again suddenly from the opposite direction.

Place towels/rags around leaky doors and windows.

Conserve water.

THE STORM IS PAST – WAIT FOR AN ALL CLEAR

Wait for the ALL CLEAR on Giant Voice. Resist your curiosity getting the best of you and going outside before the All Clear is announced.

AFTER ALL THE CLEAR IS GIVEN

Look out for and do not touch dangling or downed power lines!

Do not consume any food which might have spoiled.

Use stored water; sterilize all tap water. It could be contaminated! Consider all water contaminated until it is declared safe by Navy Public Works (on base) Public Utility Agency of Guam (PUAG).

Muster stations/EFAC locations are Charles King Fitness Center and McCool Elementary. Middle School.




Water Safety

Guam's waters offer outdoor sports enthusiasts a wide choice of recreational activities. Unfortunately, water-related activities sometimes lead to tragedy. A very real danger exists near, on and beyond the reef. For that reason, the reef is off limits to all DoD employees and their family members. That means no reef walking. The waves and current are often misleading and can sweep the unwary over the reef and they may drown.

Water Safety Tips

- Make note of where lifeguards are present and where it is safe for swimming.
- Never swim, snorkel or dive alone. Always have a buddy with you and keep an eye on each other.
- While in the water, wear protective footwear to prevent painful coral cuts or stepping on sea urchins.
- Wear fins when you snorkel. There are some strong currents here especially when the tide is going out. You may need the added power fins can give you.
- When snorkeling, wear a snorkeler's vest. This will help you stay afloat if you become tired or the current pulls you out to sea.
- Become familiar with the dangerous aquatic life in these waters. Treat all shells as poisonous and don't handle them.
- Cancel snorkeling, diving or boating plans when weather forecasters have issued hazardous surf or small craft warnings.
- Use extreme caution if snorkeling in areas with rip currents. Rip currents usually occur in areas where there is a cut in the reef. Do not swim in these areas when hazardous surf is likely.
- If a rip current catches you, don't panic. If you can't make any headway, grab onto a coral formation and pull yourself to shore.
- Protective gloves are real assets here. If the water is too deep for grabbing the coral, swim with the current away from the reef. This will prevent the water from continually slamming you into the sharp coral. Once you have cleared the reef, stay afloat and wait for a rescue team.

Firearm Registration

REGISTER ALL FIREARMS IN ACCORDANCE WITH BASE AND LOCAL LAWS

Bringing firearms to Guam has several steps that must be strictly followed, as failure to do so could result in charges under Guam Customs or criminal law as well as the confiscation of your firearms. Additionally, Naval Base Guam regulates the transportation and storage of firearms on base. The failure to follow base regulations could result in charges under the UCMJ.

Be sure to thoroughly read the following information in its entirety. The cost of registering one firearm totals \$173, with an added cost of \$49 for each additional firearm.

Naval Base Guam

Bringing and storing firearms on Naval Base Guam (NBG) must be done in accordance with NAVBASEGUAMINST 5530.6B. To bring firearms on base while awaiting the disposition of the Guam registration process, you must complete the following steps:

- 1. Declare that you have personal firearms at the gate upon initial entry. You should ensure your firearms are not loaded and inaccessible when entering. You will be escorted or directed to proceed to the NBG Armory (directions will be provided).
- 2. There you will complete the required paperwork with NBG Armory personnel and will be provided with receipts for all stored personal firearms. You will be unable to retrieve these until you have your Guam Firearm ID Card in hand.

Once you have your Guam Firearm ID, you may return to the NBG Armory to retrieve your firearms to get them inspected by the GPD Armory. After you have been issued individual registration cards for each firearm (this process is explained below), you will need to return to the NBG Armory to finalize documentation. At this point you may store your firearms in base housing in a locked container or with proper trigger/chamber locking mechanisms. Firearms may not be stored in unaccompanied housing or personal vehicles. Refer to NAVBASEGUAMINST 5530.6B and housing policy for detailed storage requirements.

The Armory will also issue you an Authorization to Transport Personal Weapons. The procedures contained within must be strictly followed at all times when transporting firearms on and off the base.

Guam Customs

Firearms, whether brought on island via household goods or on your flight, must be declared to Guam Customs upon entry. When bringing firearms via your flight, proceed to Guam Customs in the airport once you retrieve your checked baggage holding the firearms.

For firearms shipped in household goods (HHG) shipments (ammunition cannot be shipped), you must be present for the extraction of your firearms prior to the delivery of your HHG. It is recommended you note the container your firearms are placed in to expedite their extraction once you are in Guam. Moving companies CANNOT deliver your HHG until all firearms are extracted. Your moving company will help you make arrangements with Guam Customs to get this process completed.

Once your firearms are inspected by Guam Customs officials, you will be provided with the paperwork necessary to complete registration with the Guam Police Department (GPD).

IMPORTANT! When the Customs paperwork is received you have 30 calendar days to complete the registration process. Failure to do so within this time frame could result in felony weapons charges under Guam criminal law. A background check that takes up to 10 working days is part of the process. It is essential you begin this immediately!

Guam Police Department

There are several steps towards completing the registration process. For up-to-date information refer to the GPD web site at http://gpd.guam.gov/faq/

First, you must obtain a Guam Firearm ID Card. To do this you must go to the Guam Police Department (GPD) Records and ID Section located on the 1st Floor of the International Trade Center (ITC) building in Suite 131. See below for address and hours

A \$47 money order or cashier's check made payable to the "Superior Court of Guam". This fee is for the FBI background check. An additional \$34 for the cost of fingerprinting. This payment can be made via cash or card (an additional convenience fee will be assessed if using a card). Fingerprinting will be completed during this initial visit. When the background check is complete and approved (ten working days), you must return and pay an additional \$43 (cash or card) to receive your Guam Firearms ID, which will be good for three years. Now that you have your firearms ID in hand proceed, with your firearms you have retrieved from the NBG Armory, to the GPD Armory. It is located on Neptune Drive in Barrigada. Directions are provided: When coming from Naval Base Guam, take Marine Corps Drive (Route 1) to Purple Heart Memorial Highway (Route 8). Continue down Route 8 and at the intersection of Route 8 and Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway (Route 10) turn left onto Seagull Ave. Continue on until you reach Corsair Road and turn left. At the end of Corsair Road turn right onto Neptune Ave. The GPD Armory will be on the right side towards the end of Neptune Road. Phone: 671-475-8618, Hours: 0730 – 1330 M-F. You will need the following: A Bill of Sale; OR a Certificate of Ownership; OR a notarized document containing the descriptions of all firearms (if needed, Naval Base Guam Legal Services or the Sector Guam Command Secretary can notarize your documentation) The Customs declaration form Your valid firearms ID A safety inspection form which will be issued by the GPD Armory Firearms Once each firearm is inspected, the GPD Armory will provide you with the necessary paperwork to return

to the Records and ID Section. Here you will complete the registration process by paying \$49 per firearm

If you desire to get a concealed carry permit, you may begin the process at this point by completing the required paperwork and paying the additional fees. Possession of a Guam concealed carry permit does not







